New Curriculum Handy Help for Parents

Prefix

A prefix is a grapheme (letter, or group of letters) that is added in front of a root (base) word. Common prefixes include un, re, pre, de, dis, im, mis, in and many more. A prefix changes the meaning of the root or base word. Therefore, children need to understand the meanings of prefixes and how they affect the words they're attached to.

For example, the prefix dis- is used to mean 'opposite of', 'not', 'remove' or 'reverse'. When added to the front of the word 'appear' it becomes 'disappear'.

Did you know?

The long /oo/ vowel phoneme can be represented by 12 different graphemes.
