#### Principal's Address

The last term of the year is flying by and on top of the wonderful focus on teaching and learning that we maintain across our classrooms each week, we're planning and organising a wide range of special end-of year events for our students, including the school leader selection for 2024. It's wonderful to see so many students aspiring towards leadership and being so willing to engage with the school as active citizens. I personally congratulate every student aspiring towards a leadership position.

Term 4 is an important time of the year for assessing, reporting and reflecting on progress, not just in relation to our students but also in regard to our school strategic directions, initiatives and targets across the school. Teachers are working diligently to not only write reports for each student that reflect their unique talents and abilities, but also looking at our whole school processes to see what we can improve on next year.

This term we have had some wonderful academic results across our school. In Year 1 we have seen an impressive uplift of nearly 30% in our Phonics Screening Check. This increase in student phonic knowledge will support our youngest learners to be successful readers and writers. Well done Mrs Nash and Year 1 on your hard work this year as we have shifted the focus on how we teach students to read.

In the Year 3 and Year 4 Check-in assessment, students are achieving at above statistically similar schools in reading and numeracy, an amazing uplift from recent years. This is reflective of changes to learning and support structures, more regular data analysis and teacher commitment to professional learning and deeply reflective practice. A big thank you to all staff for engaging so deeply with new learning and working so hard to put this into action in the classroom every day.

Have a lovely two weeks and I look forward to seeing many of you at our upcoming end of year events.

#### Communicating with Staff – Who should I talk to?

It is important that parents can access teachers at times that are convenient to both parties. To ensure that parents can have their questions answered or concerns dealt with effectively and efficiently, our school has some key protocols to support open and honest channels of communication.

#### School practices and procedures

- If you have a concern or question about your child or the school's programs, please consult the guide *on the following page* to determine who you should speak to first.
- Before school, teachers are busy making final preparations for starting the day. Teachers will be in meetings or in their classrooms setting up for the day after 8.15am. This is not a convenient time to approach the teacher for a chat about your child without prior arrangement. If you have a quick message to pass on to your child's teacher, that should be fine. For any more substantial matter, please make an appointment for a more suitable time.
- If you need to get an urgent message to your child during the school day, for example, if going home arrangements have changed, please contact the Office before 2:15pm to allow time for messages to be given. Please don't email urgent messages as these may not be seen.
- Please send emails to the school email address not to teachers' personal address.
- If you send a message via the parent portal, please be aware that teachers are on class and have playground duties throughout the day.

#### Respectful communication with staff

- Please be respectful when using Facebook or other forms of social media including WhatsApp. This is not a forum for raising issues. Please directly raise any issues with the appropriate staff member who can help you.
- Please do not email teachers directly. All emails to classroom teachers should go via our school email address <u>holgate-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>. Alternatively, you may wish to cc <u>prue.king@det.nsw.edu.au</u> and <u>taryn.bergan@det.nsw.edu.au</u>. These will be passed on to classroom teachers ASAP.
- Messaging through the SENTRAL portal can be used for school related activities. Messages will be responded to Monday Friday (or their specified days on duty) between the hours of 8:15am and 5:00pm. Staff will check messages once per day and will attempt to respond within 48 hours. Please do not send urgent messages through the portal as teachers are unlikely to see them on a teaching day.

Concern	Action
Academic progress or welfare of your own child	Contact your child's teacher by note, parent portal, email, school office (02 4367 7444) or in person to arrange a suitable time to discuss any issues. If possible, state the nature of the concern to allow teachers time to collect information that may assist.
Actions of other students	Contact the class teacher for further information, as above. The class teacher may ask for the executive to address the issue in some cases.
School policy or practice	Contact the school office (02 4367 7444) and state nature of concern. The office staff will advise you of the appropriate person to meet with and assist you to make an appointment to meet with the appropriate member of staff.

Actions of a staff member	Contact the school office (02 4367 7444) and state nature of concern. The office staff will advise you of the appropriate person to meet with and assist you to make an appointment to meet with the appropriate member of staff.
Change of information	Contact the school office (02 4367 7444) to convey information about change of address, telephone number, emergency contact, custody details, health issues, medication etc. This can be done in person, on the phone, or via email.


